RECOMMENDATION

Approve the induction of Nora Gonzalez Maher and Timothy Richey to be inducted into the "Circle of Service", located in Lions Park, adjacent to the Neighborhood Community Center.

BACKGROUND

At the July 15, 1996 meeting, City Council adopted an amendment to Council Policy Number 800-4 (Attachment 1) that established the Circle of Service in Lions Park to honor those citizens who have provided significant service to the City of Costa Mesa, made an extraordinary contribution to the City, or contributed to the history of Costa Mesa.

The nominated individual must have been deceased a minimum of six (6) months prior to the nomination; must have been a resident of Costa Mesa for minimum of eight (8) years; must have been involved in community service for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years or have given their life in the service of the nation or community.

Peter Donald Maher III has requested that City Council consider approving Nora Gonzalez Maher for induction into the Circle of Service (Attachment 2). Dieter Kutz has requested that the City Council consider approving Timothy Richey for induction into the Circle of Service (Attachment 3).

The nominations were submitted to the Parks and Recreation Commission at their April 28, 2004 monthly meeting for their consideration and requesting them to make a recommendation to City Council to approve or deny the requests. The Parks and Recreation Commission reviewed the nominations and recommend to City Council to approve both Ms. Maher's and Mr. Richey's induction into the Circle of Service.

ANALYSIS

The following information provides appropriate justification for City Council to accept Nora Gonzalez Maher and Timothy Richey into the "Circle of Service".

Nora Gonzalez Maher was killed in an automobile accident on July 15, 2003. She was a resident of Costa Mesa for over eight years and her contributions to the City included her most noteworthy accomplishment, co-founding "Save Our Youth" (SOY). Nora also worked as a pre-school teacher, an instructional aid at Pomona School, a migrant home school aid and an incoming student

evaluator for the Newport Mesa Unified School District. Along with all of these accomplishments, Nora also helped to start MADRES, a support group for mostly immigrant mothers who need help coping with the pressures of a new culture and restless adolescent children. Nora Gonzalez Maher meets the requirements to be inducted into the Circle of Service.

Timothy Richey passed away on August 5, 2003. Timothy was a resident of Costa Mesa for over twenty years and was heavily involved with his community, especially with regard to the Boy Scouts. He was involved in scouting in Costa Mesa for over three decades serving hundreds of young people in the process. Timothy served as Scoutmaster of Troop 339 in Costa Mesa for over eight years and also served as a committee member, Assistant Scoutmaster, Webelos Den Leader, Camporee Chairman and staff member, Trainer for Junior Leadership Sessions, and Chairman for Webelos Woods. Timothy also received the Award of Merit and his district's Scoutmaster of the Year Award, and was the recipient of the presidential Scoutmaster Award. In addition to all of these awards and recognitions Timothy was also a member of the Costa Mesa Lions Breakfast Club, Kiwanis Club and Boys Club. Timothy also volunteered his time to the Red Cross, Goodwill, and Muscular Dystrophy organizations. Timothy Richey meets the requirements to be inducted into the Circle of Service.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

1. Do not approve nominees as proposed.

FISCAL REVIEW

The estimated cost for purchase and installation of the plaques is \$220 each. The families have submitted checks to cover the purchase of plaques.

LEGAL REVIEW

The City Council approved the establishment of the Circle of Service as part of Council Policy 800-4. All requests for induction into the Circle of Service are submitted to the Parks and Recreation Commission. The Commission shall make a recommendation to City Council to approve or deny the application.

CONCLUSION

The Parks and Recreation Commissioners recommended that City Council approve Nora Gonzalez Maher's and Timothy Richey's induction into the Circle of Service. The requests to induct Nora Gonzalez Maher and Timothy Richey meet the criteria for approval established by Council Policy 800-4. If approved, the induction would occur Friday, July 23, 2004. Mr. Tom Thompson will also be inducted into the Circle of Service at that time.
